

Back To School Month is celebrated every August to gear up parents, teachers, schools, and students for a season of education.

This Month, your Justice Team has selected <u>Kate's Club</u> as our Donate the Plate Recipient.

# Kate's Club

Kate's Club mission is to empower children and teens, their families, and young adults facing life after the death of a parent, sibling, caregiver, or someone important to them. They're working to create a world in which it's okay to grieve.

In 2003, Kate's Club launched in Atlanta, GA with a gathering of six children for a social outing at a bowling alley and has matured into a dynamic, statewide nonprofit that has helped more than 10,000 grieving children and teens, their families, and young adults understand how to cope with their grief and know they are not alone.

Kate's Club is a place where being separated from someone important to you can be connective. Where experiencing a death can mean entering a new chapter of life. And where missing someone can lead to feeling seen. In this club, grief is challenging but it's also growth — an example of how every part of life can become a chance to have a positive experience if you're supported and among a community.

Their programs are guided by the National Alliance for Children's Grief's Standards of Practice. Kate's Club grief support programs for kids, teens, and their families focus on

social connections, improving healthy coping strategies, and building confidence and self-esteem. Kate's Club provides grief s upport programs for young adults (18–30) so that they can connect with others who are also facing life after the death of someone important to them. Their programs for parents and caregivers provide support, education, and resources to adult family members supporting children or teens while grieving the death of someone important.

In 20 years, Kate's Club has empowered tens of thousands of grievers throughout Georgia through direct service, education and advocacy.


# **Caring for Our Feathered Friends**
